Freshwater invertebrates play important roles in the communities and ecosystems of which they are part. They serve as food for other organisms and are intricately involved in subtle ecological processes such as the breakdown and cycling of organic matter and nutrients, much like the role of earthworms in soil. Because freshwater invertebrates live in many different environments and play important roles in ecosystems, they can be used easily in outreach programs concerned with conservation, biodiversity, natural resource management, and environmental stewardship. 
